LIMITATION Ambitious principals and school boards always desire their schools to rank high on any accredited list published in the state. This, although in itself commendable, has produced an unfortunate tendency. It is a common thing at present in Nebraska for graded schools with only a few teachers to undertake more high school work than the district can afford, and in most of these cases more than can be done well. There are schools of from four to twelve teachers undertaking to give four full years of high school instruction. This of necessity withdraws attention and financial support from the lower grades, which benefit more people in the community than do the higher grades.
